Charity is a Virtue – but *Tzedakah* is a Mitzvah

If you're like me, you probably grew up with a little tin "tzedakah box" in your home or you saw one at the synagogue. For this reason, we generally associate the word *tzedakah* with the act of giving money for people in need or to support a cause, like planting trees in Israel. We often translate *tzedakah* as "charity," but *tzedakah* is not just about giving money and it isn't charity.

The word "charity" derives from the Latin *caritas*. Originally *caritas* meant preciousness, value. In Christian theology, *caritas* came to mean unconditional love for others. Thomas Aquinas defined it as the love we feel for others that extends from our love for God, and he considered charity the highest virtue. Over time, charity came to be associated with benevolent giving out of love. Perhaps the closest word we have for charity in Hebrew is *Hesed*, which means loving-kindness. It is to do for others out of compassion.

Tzedakah, however, is not charity. *Tzedakah* has a very different etymology. The Biblical concept of *tzedakah* comes from the word *tzedek*, which means "justice." *Tzedek* is not a sentiment nor really a "virtue," as such. *Tzedek* is a mitzvah—a religious duty we are obligated to perform. It is about creating a just society that conforms with God's vision for humanity. "There shall never cease to be needy ones in your land," says the Torah "so you must open your hand to the poor and needy in your land" (Deut. 15:11). This kind of giving does not flow from our feelings and it doesn't even require good intentions. While charity is about giving from the "goodness of your heart," *tzedakah* is about doing what's right and just regardless of how you feel. It is certainly good to be kind and compassionate, and giving out of love is certainly better than giving begrudgingly, but giving to others in Judaism is about making the world more just.

The Torah legislates that Jews must tithe ten percent of their earnings to the poor (see, Deuteronomy 26:12 and Leviticus 19:9). The medieval legal authority Maimonides states that we are obligated to give to the poor and that it

is the responsibility of a community to collect what is essentially a tax, which is distributed in the form of money and food (Mishna Torah, "Laws Concerning Giving to the Poor" 7).

During this month in which we observe the American holiday of Thanksgiving (fashioned after the Biblical harvest festival of Sukkot), let us resolve to show our gratitude by taking up the obligation of *tzedakah*. Here are a few suggestions:

1. Think about a cause or a problem that you care about—an injustice in the world you would like to help correct. Make a contribution or give some of your time to a cause you feel will make the world a little more just.
2. For one week, try giving to every person in need who asks (even if you don't want to). Practice putting aside judgment and simply seeing the humanity in the person before you.
3. Sit down and estimate what your annual giving is. Make a list of all the organizations and causes you give to and consider how much you give relative to your income. How closely does it match the Biblical tithe of ten percent?

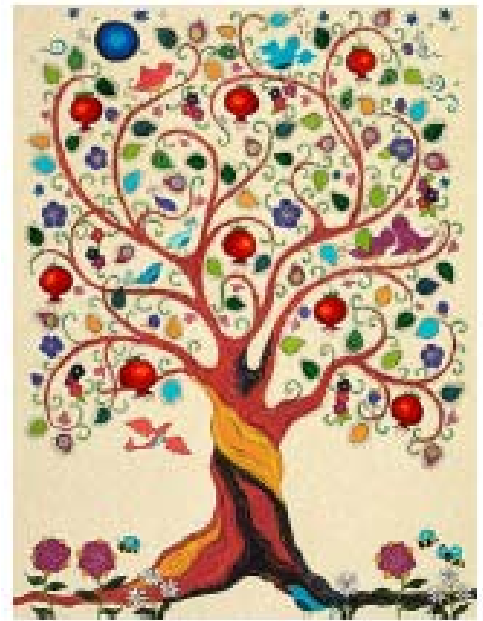

*Ben Zoma says:
Who is wise?
The one who learns from every person...*

I believe that this new way of working collaboratively, learning from one another and being willing to take risks in being innovative will result in programs that will be impactful both for participants and ultimately our community. We are committed to ensuring that our programs for the next generation of Jewish leaders will offer opportunities for meaningful and lasting engagement. 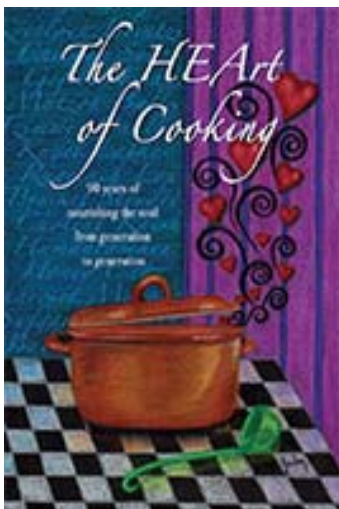
HEA Sisterhood

"Rub" for Turkey

(submitted by Didi Zeichner)

For the Rub

- 6 tablespoons olive oil
- 3 cloves garlic – minced
- 2 teaspoons cumin
- 1 teaspoon paprika
- Pinch of pepper

Combine olive oil, garlic, cumin, paprika and pepper in a small bowl.

For the Turkey

- 1 Reynolds oven bag, turkey size
- 1 onion quartered
- 3 stalks of celery cut into 4 inch pieces
- Kosher salt for inside cavity of turkey
- Few tablespoons flour for inside of bag
- Disposable gloves

Prepare turkey by rinsing, removing insides and any feathers. Shake flour into the bag, and place the turkey inside. Shake kosher salt into the cavity of the turkey then add the onion and celery. Using disposable gloves, spread the rub all over the turkey, trying to coat it from top to bottom. Close and tie the bag. Use a knife to make six slits into the bag to allow airflow. Follow directions on time and temperature according to the size of the turkey. If the turkey is stuffed, omit onion and celery in the cavity.
